KIS and Contact: Workshop

The workshop will explain the requirements under KIS for public information that describes the proportion of contact time against other forms of learning activity that students undertake during their course of study. Beyond discussion of the technical requirements and the kinds of problems this might pose for art and design, the session will discuss the philosophical and pedagogical issues with quantifying learning in units of time. The workshop will discuss a number of themes, for example: how is art and design learning to be quantified? What forms of learning in art and design do not fit the proposed model? What risks does KIS pose in terms of curriculum design and delivery modes? What are the wider issues for academic, technical, professional staff and graduate teaching roles?
